CCC TROPHIES

TUCKNOTT TROPHY



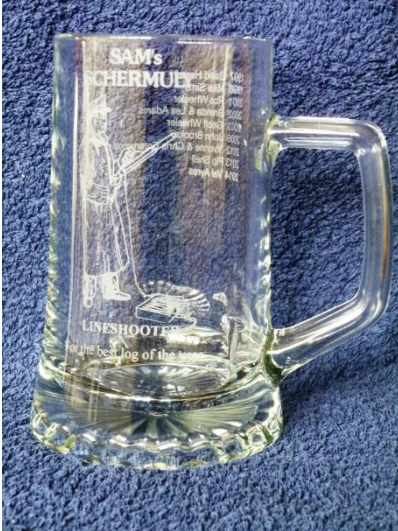
- An Ornate Wooden Trophy in the outline of a Sailing Ship, with Mounted Brass Fittings, Intricate Ropework and an Inscribed Plaque on the Base. Winners names inscribed on individual shields.
- Donated by Ray Tucknott. First presented in 1991.
- Originally awarded for "Merit". Now to be awarded for the highest number of planned CCC Cruises attended in the season.

CATTEWATER CUP



- A Small Engraved Pewter Cup with Lid mounted on a varnished Wooden Plinth. Winners names inscribed on a brass plaque on the plinth.
- Donated by Anna and Phil Jones. First presented in 1994.
- Originally awarded for "Participation". Now to be awarded for the best cruising achievement and level of participation made in the season by a new member. A new member being defined as one who has belonged to the Club for less than 3 full seasons.

SCHERMULY TROPHY



- Engraved Glass Mug. Winners names inscribed on the rear face of the Mug.
- Original 10 Trophies donated by Sam Parry-Jones. First presented in 1994.
- To be awarded for the best Cruise Log/Report. A Schermuly was an early rocket propelled line throwing apparatus. The trophy was named as such for award to the member "shooting the best line". A certain amount of exaggeration is encouraged!!

BADEN WEBB MEMORIAL CUP



- A Silver Plated Trophy Mounted on a Polished Plastic Plinth with an Inscribed Plaque. Winners names inscribed on a brass plaque on the plinth.
- Donated by Mary Webb in memory of her husband, Baden. First presented in 1997.
- Originally awarded for an "Outstanding Feat of Seamanship". Now to be awarded for the highest number of different ports and anchorages visited by a member in their own boat in the season.

WALKER TROPHY



- A Coloured Glass Sailing Ship mounted on a Wooden Plinth with an Inscribed Plaque. Winners names inscribed on a brass plaque on the plinth.
- Donated by Shirley Walker in memory of her husband, Mike. First presented in 2002.
- To be awarded for the longest (days at sea/nautical miles logged) individual cruise made in the season. A handicap system to be applied so that smaller vessels logging less nautical miles, but a similar number of days at sea, would be equally eligible for award as larger yachts doing more miles in the same number of days.

HAPPY SNAPPER TROPHY



- An Old Digital Camera Mounted on a Wooden Plinth with an Inscribed Plaque. Winners names inscribed on a brass plaque on the plinth.
- Donated by Nigel Vaughan-Smith. First presented in 2014.
- To be awarded to the winner of the Annual Cattewater Cruising Club Photographic Competition.
